

**EARLY NOTICE AND PUBLIC REVIEW OF A PROPOSED ACTIVITIES  
IN A 100-YEAR/500-YEAR FLOODPLAIN AND/OR WETLAND**

TO: ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND INDIVIDUALS:

This is to give notice that Fayette County, PA has determined that the following proposed actions under the FY2019-2020 CDBG Programs (Contract Numbers: C000073806 and 76575) - and any future similar projects funded in contracts yet to be determined (Contract Numbers: TBD) - are located in a 100-year/500-year floodplain and/or wetland, and Fayette County, PA will be identifying and evaluating practicable alternatives to locating the action in the floodplain and/or wetland and the potential impacts on the floodplain and/or wetland from the proposed action, as required by Executive Order 11988 and/or 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands.

The proposed action involves recreation improvements at an existing recreation facility known as Redstone Park along New Salem Road in Redstone Township, Fayette County, PA. The action will provide funding to reconstruct an existing walking trail that is deteriorated and causes hazardous conditions for park visitors. The total number of linear feet involved in a Special Flood Hazard Area (Zone AE) floodplain is approximately 2,580LF.

Fayette County, PA is reviewing the above action in addition to future similar actions involving recreation improvements whereas the existing facilities or a portion of the facilities are located in a predicted floodplain and/or wetland area located in Fayette County, including the entitlement townships of Bullskin, Dunbar, Georges, German, Luzerne, Menallen, North Union, Redstone, and South Union Townships for their effect on passage of floodwaters, alternatives to floodplain development, and for consistency with federal, state, and local policies and regulations on floodplain management. The total number of linear feet and type of floodplain/wetland area for future projects is yet to be determined.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and/or wetlands and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Commenters are encouraged to offer alternative sites outside of the floodplains and/or wetlands, alternative methods to serve the same project purpose, and methods to minimize and mitigate impacts. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information and request for public comment about floodplains and/or wetlands can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks and impacts associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains and/or wetlands, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.
